

# Gravity Forms QR Code

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## 1. QUICK SETUP

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### 1.1. INSTALL

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- Upload and Activate the „**Gravity Forms QR Code**“ Plugin
- Setup a new feed for your form and define the fields to generate a QR code
- Define if you need to attach the QR Code with your notification eMails or confirmations

## 2. UPLOAD AND ACTIVATE

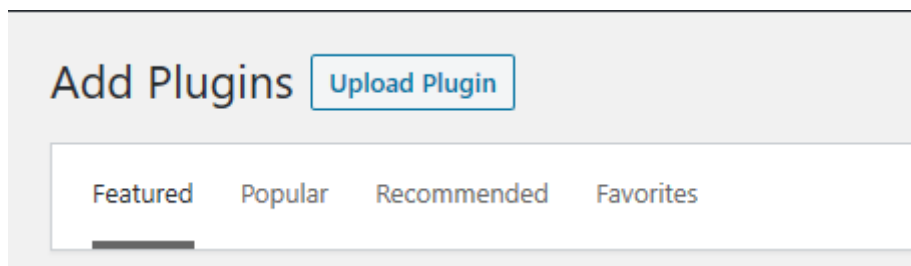
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### 2.1. UPLOAD

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After you downloaded and saved the '**Graviy Forms QR Code**' plugin you have to upload it to your Wordpress installation.

Please go to you 'Plugins/Add New' Menu, select 'Upload' from the top links and choose the downloaded ZIP-File at the upload-field.



After selecting the File please press the „Install Now“ Button.



## 2.2. ACTIVATE


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After the Plugin is uploaded you will get a success screen.

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### 3. SETUP YOUR FORM AND FIELD SETTINGS

To generate a QR Code you need to add a new QR Code feed at the GF QR Code settings.

### 3.1. SETTING UP THE DATABASE TABLE

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At the Gravity-Forms Feed Settings you have to setup a name for your feed, a label that will be displayed under the QR code and the size of the generated Image.

<b>QR Code Label</b>	A small text that will be displayed under the QR code

<b>Feed Condition</b>	Add conditional logic to your feed processing



### 3.2. FIELD SETTINGS

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At the “Template Fields” section you can setup the fields of the form that will be used as data to generate the QR Code.

Form Fields

Please select the needed fields from your form. <br />It's possible to add any text as you need at the first field. <br />You also can use the Placeholders {tab} to insert a TAB, {space} to insert a SPACE or {newline} to insert a NEWLINE.

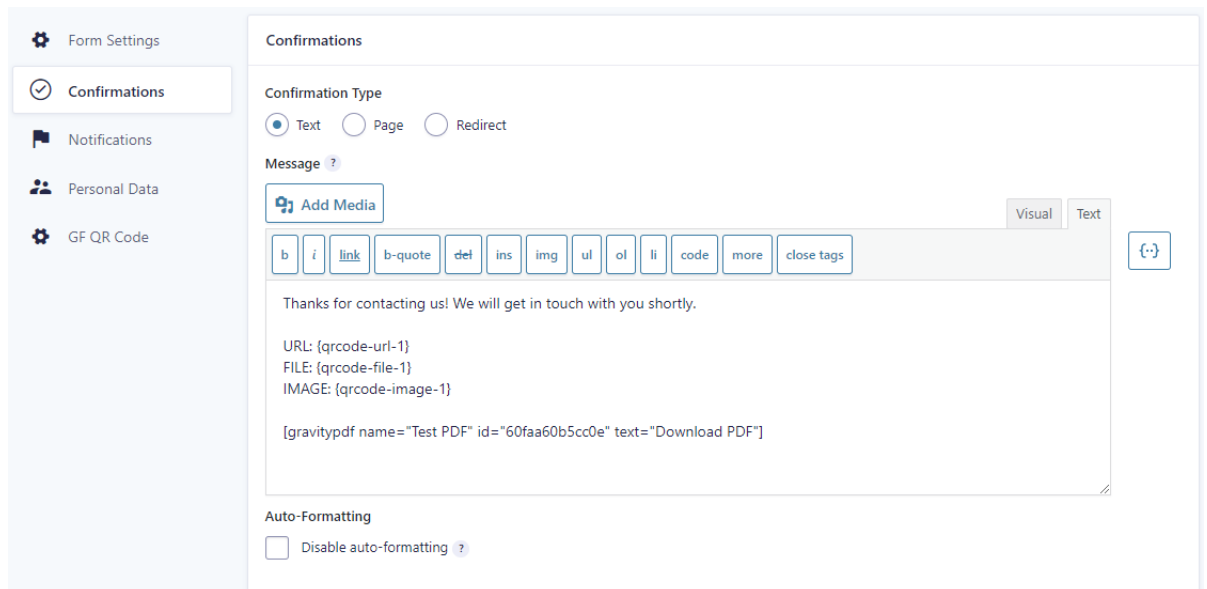
You also can setup any text you need at the input field for any qr-code line.

Placeholders :

{tab}                      to insert a TAB  
{space}                    to insert a SPACE  
{newline}                to insert a NEWLINE

#### 4. ADD YOUR QR CODE TO A CONFIRMATION

At the default Gravity Forms Confirmation Setting you can use two new Merge-Tags to insert your QR Code to your Confirmation.



<i>Merge Tag</i>	<i>Description</i>
<b>QR URL:nn</b>	Will be replaced with the full Url of the generated QR Code file for this feed.  {qrcode-url-nn}
<b>QR FILE:nn</b>	Will be replaced with the full name and path of the generated QR Code file for this Feed.  {qrcode-file-nn}
<b>QR IMAGE:nn</b>	Will be replaced with a HTML Image (IMG) link of the generated QR Code for this feed.  {qrcode-image-nn}

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## 5. ADD YOUR QR CODE TO A NOTIFICATION

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At the default Gravity Forms Notification Setting you can use two new Merge-Tags to insert your QR Code to your Notification ( See point 4 )

You also can attach the generated QR Code files as attachment to the Notification E-Mail.

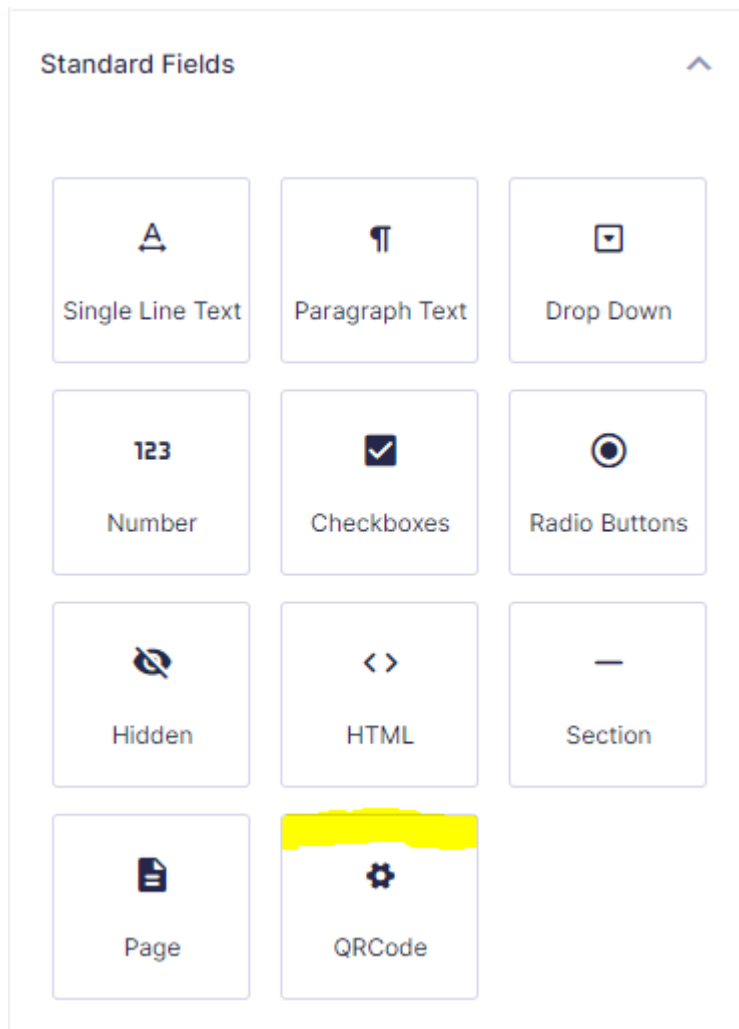

## 6. USING THE QR-CODE FIELD

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At the Form-Editor you'll have a new field to store the URL of the generated QR-Code.

The field will be hidden at the Front-End Form.




With this new field it's possible to view the generated QR-Code from the Entry-List or der Entry-Details-Pages.
